

Final touches for community hub building

Stage 1 of Wedderburn's Donaldson Park Community Hub is effectively complete, with the car park and landscaping receiving finishing touches.



Severe rainfall events in December and January saw the car park works delayed, with expected completion in the coming weeks (subject to weather and contractor availability).

Stage 2 of the project is also underway. This stage includes an all-abilities playspace, additional landscaping and internal paths adjacent to the new building.

The project has been made possible thanks to funding from the Commonwealth Government, Victorian Government, Donaldson Park Community Asset Committee, user groups, the community, Inglewood & Districts Community Enterprises Limited and Council. The Donaldson Park Steering Committee has also provided input throughout the course of the project, including the building's design.

Pyramid Hill Community Centre project

Work has begun on Stage 1 of the redevelopment of the Pyramid Hill Community Centre.

The contract for this stage of the project was awarded to Searle Brothers at last November's Council Meeting for \$2.9 million.

Stage 1 includes:

- Allied health wing to accommodate Northern District Community Health and Maternal Child Health services
- senior citizens room
- · upgraded toilet facilities
- · renovation of the current hall and kitchen
- · expansion of storage
- improved car parking and access to the building

Council thanks all those who contributed to getting the Pyramid Hill Community Centre to this stage of construction - including the Pyramid Hill senior citizens, Northern District Community Health and a number of other community organisations.

We look forward to working together with local organisations and the community on the first stage of this major redevelopment.

Funding for Stage 1 construction has been made possible with the support of the Victorian State Government's Regional Infrastructure Fund.

Council has also provided funding towards the project.

Additionally, Loddon Shire Council was invited to submit a funding application to the Commonwealth Government's Growing Regions Program to deliver the final stage of the community centre.

The final stage includes the construction of a community wing to accommodate the neighbourhood house, library services and a community gym, with further parking included.

The outcome of this funding submission is to be announced around March/April this year. If this funding submission is successful, it will enable Council to deliver the project in its entirety.

Inglewood Sports Centre Master Plan

Council is currently developing a master plan for the Inglewood Community Sports Centre.

The master plan will identify and clarify opportunities, challenges and limitations at the centre, as well as provide direction to Council and user groups for its future development over the next 10 years.

The master plan will focus on the sport and recreation reserve, including the main complex, oval, lawn and hard courts, cricket nets and the adjacent Riding Club, and Inglewood Cars and Bikes Club.

The master plan will be responsive to community expectations, as well as being achievable, realistic and attainable within the Council's budgetary framework.



Council is currently developing a master plan for the Inglewood Community Sports Centre.

Community members were invited to participate in a survey, which closed 26 February, to provide input into the master plan.

This input is now being incorporated into the development of the draft master plan, which is anticipated to be available for public feedback in late March.

Following this feedback period, the final draft master plan will be considered by Council for further public exhibition and feedback.

Funding for Inglewood Streetscape

Council has allocated \$1 million from The Inglewood community has its Strategic Fund for detailed design and costing of the Inglewood Streetscape project. It will also provide seed funding towards future funding applications for this project.

Councillors allocated the funds at the November 2023 Council Meeting.

The Inglewood Streetscape Project aims to enhance the visual appeal, functionality, safety and cultural significance of the streetscape in Inglewood. The project will consider various elements, including:

- beautification
- kerb and channel improvements
- footpaths
- underground power installation
- · greening initiatives
- · traffic calming
- pedestrian safety enhancements
- · overall amenity improvement
- place-making
- integration of public art
- · heritage walking trails

DTP maintenance contract ends

Council's road maintenance contract with the Department of Transport and Planning (DTP) officially ended on 31 December last year.

For the past 30 years Loddon Shire provided a road maintenance service to DTP (formally VicRoads) for 394km of arterial roads within Loddon Shire.

SprayLine Road Services is now responsible for maintaining the DTP network within Loddon Shire. These roads are:

Works for Pyramid Yarraberb Road, Canary Island culverts, reseals

Reconstruction of 2.6km of Pyramid Yarraberb Road is expected to start in March, with works to be completed by Berne Fleming Civil Pty Ltd.

The Pyramid Yarraberb Road runs north south between Boort Mitiamo Road and Loddon Valley Highway. It is an important connecting road between Bendigo, Pyramid Hill and surrounding areas.

The road was affected by the October 2022 flood event, resulting in damage to 1.36km of the road, requiring reconstruction work.

Canary Island culvert replacement

Works on the replacement of three culverts along Canary Island Leaghur Road, Canary Island are expected to start in April.

The works include a new 6m by 1.8m twin culvert, 9m by 1.8m triple cell culvert and a 3m by 1.5m culvert.

The culvert replacements are being completed by Avard Civil.

Annual reseal program

Council's annual reseal program is underway. This year's program will see reseals on 56.7km of Council roads, with a total area of 307.9m².

Resealing works are taking place on various roads throughout the Shire including in Auchmore, Arnold, Campbells Forest, Dingee, Eastville, Eddington, Inglewood, Kamarooka North, Kingower, Kurraca and Lake Marmal.

Additionally, resealing works are taking place on roads in Laanecoorie, Llanelly, Pompapiel, Powlett Plains, Pyramid Hill, Raywood, Rheola, Salisbury West, Serpentine, Tandarra and Wychitella.

Works update

Township street improvements

The tender for the annual footpath construction program is anticipated to go out in March.

Building improvement program

The tender for Inglewood Town Hall and Boort Historical Society (former Court House) roof work, has closed.

Capital works completed

From 1 July 2023 to 31 December 2023 road projects delivered by the Works department saw the completion of 9km of road re-sheets and 9km of road shoulder re-sheets.

Construction works are continuing on the Echuca Serpentine Road and Newbridge Road.

Road maintenance inspection

From 1 July 2023 to 31 December 2023, 471 inspections were completed (2,630 defects raised), with 98.9% of all inspections completed before their due date.

Road maintenance rectification

From 1 July 2023 to 31 December 2023, 3,151 defects were rectified, with 96.9% of all defects (3,053 in total) completed before their due date.

Road maintenance grading

From 1 July 2023 to 31 December 2023, 504 maintenance grading work actions were completed resulting in 1,047km of grading.

Parks and townships

From 1 July 2023 to 31 December 2023, 2,009 programmed maintenance works were carried out as well as rectification of defects. These included on footpaths, street and park trees, garden beds, grass mowing and playgrounds.



Waste vouchers

Vouchers 3 and 4 are due to expire on 30 June 2024.

Vouchers can be used to dispose of up to four cubic metres of general domestic waste free of charge at Council's landfill and transfer stations.

Flood recovery update

Storms and torrential rain experienced in December and January impacted the homes and properties of many members of our community.

Our thoughts are with all those impacted by these events, particularly those who had their homes or properties impacted more than once in such a short period of time.

We would like to thank the SES and CFA volunteers, community organisations and community members who responded and provided support to our community during these events.

Council is working closely with State Government agencies to understand the level of impact of this event to inform the recovery supports going forward.

Roads and infrastructure works continue

Works are continuing on flood recovery from the October 2022 flood event. Currently 3.1km of resheet work is underway on unsealed roads near Bridgewater and Newbridge.

Council officers have inspected flood damage resulting from the December 2023 flood event. In total, 220 instances of damage have been identified as a result of the event.

Healthy Loddon Campaspe

Our Healthy Loddon Campaspe (HLC) initiative is working with Boort District Health (BDH) to revitalise the Community Garden at the Health Service (*pictured*). Thanks to those community members and staff who joined our planting day on 7 February. We'll be planning more ways for the community to be involved in the garden in the coming months. Additionally, we're working with BDH and Boort Resource and Information Centre to host a series of healthy cooking days.

HLC has partnered with Inglewood Neighbourhood House and Inglewood and Districts Health Service to present *Healthy Meals on a Shoestring* – a cooking program teaching residents how to make healthy, tasty meals using pantry staples and affordable ingredients.

HLC will soon be bringing a fun new physical activity project to Inglewood and Pyramid Hill. The *Walk This Way* project promotes walking and active travel via fun wayfinding stickers and footprints on local footpaths. The project will also install outdoor seating along footpaths.

The Healthy Sports Clubs project is back again in 2024, with two bowling clubs and four football/netball clubs involved in making simple, healthy changes to their food and drink offerings.

ROSA planning underway

Council is currently preparing the Loddon Recreation, Open Space and Aquatic Strategy (ROSA).

We are fortunate to have a diverse range of open spaces in our Shire, including sport and other active recreation reserves, parks and playgrounds, swimming pools, tracks and trails as well as bushland reserves, rivers and lakes.

A key focus of the 10-year strategy will be use of these areas, and how we can encourage our community to be more active.

Input and ideas from residents will be a big part of this strategy, which is in its planning phase.

As part of this planning process, Council will be asking residents to complete a survey and select their top three ideas regarding the use of recreation facilities in the Shire.



A number of drop-in sessions were held where residents were able to further discuss their ideas and provide input directly to Council officers.

Loddon Shire ward boundary review

The ward boundaries in Loddon Shire Council are being reviewed and you can have a say.

Loddon Shire Council's ward boundaries will be independently reviewed by the Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) at the request of the Minister for Local Government to ensure all wards have a voting population within 10%.

The VEC has proposed an option for the council's ward boundaries in a preliminary report. You can share your views on this report and which model would best serve your community through a response submission to the VEC.

Response submissions for the Loddon Shire Council ward boundary are currently open and close at 5pm Wednesday 13 March. In your submission, you can also ask to speak about your views at a public hearing.

At the end of the review, the VEC will make a final recommendation to the Minister for Local Government. Any changes to the ward boundaries for Loddon Shire Council following this review are expected to apply at the next local council elections.
