

Donaldson Park Stage 1 nearing completion

Works on Stage 1 of Wedderburn's Donaldson Park Community Hub project are close to complete.

External building work, concreting around the hardstand areas and the gabion wall have been completed.

Additionally, the car park is almost finished.

Internal works, including the building's fitout are nearing completion.

Stage 2 of the project is anticipated to commence in early 2024.



The Donaldson Park Community Hub in middle of November 2023. Stage 1 works are close to completion.

This stage will include an all-abilities playspace, additional landscaping and internal paths adjacent to the new building.

The project has been made possible thanks to funding from the Commonwealth Government, Victorian Government, Donaldson Park Community Asset Committee, user groups, the community, Inglewood & Districts Community Enterprises Limited and Council.

The Donaldson Park Steering Committee has provided input throughout the course of the project, including the building's design.

Pyramid Hill Streetscape Revitalisation Project update

Works are continuing on the Pyramid Hill Streetscape Project, with works at Lions Park, including planting, complete.

Underground drainage has been installed at Kelly Park, allowing for the connection of the new barbecue shelter and for an upgraded drainage system to other areas of the precinct.

Concrete areas in front of the museum are finished, along with paths within the grassed area. Concrete works have also been completed around the Kelly Park playground area.

Works are continuing on the installation of the barbecue shelter, street furniture and the pedestrian crossing.

This project has experienced some unexpected challenges, in particular, contractors encountering a range of previously unidentified assets underground.

As a result, significant improvement works have been required to enhance stormwater drainage and water supply in Kelly Park.

This, together with some weather challenges, has affected construction.

We thank the Pyramid Hill community for their patience during this time, and assure the community that Council and the contractor are doing all they can to complete this project as soon as possible.

Community projects update

Inglewood Sports Centre Masterplan consultation

Consultation is currently underway for the Inglewood Sports Centre Masterplan.

The masterplan aims to provide strategic direction of future development within the precinct, to better facilitate long-term planning and development of recreation opportunities within Inglewood.

Whole Loddon Love

The recent Whole Loddon Love series recently marked the anniversary of the October 2022 floods with live music events held across Pyramid Hill, Boort, Newbridge (pictured) and Bridgewater. Spanning over two weekends, these events not only celebrated local talent and community spirit but also played a significant role in supporting flood recovery efforts.

The series raised just under \$5,000 for local flood impacted communities across the Shire. Funds raised will go directly back into the local fire brigades in Newbridge and Bridgewater, the Pyramid Hill Progress Association, and the Boort District School.

Calivil Bowling Club - synthetic green installation

Works to install a synthetic green at the Calivil Bowling Club are complete.

The installation of the synthetic surface will enable use of the bowling green year round and reduce volunteer labour previously required to maintain a natural surface.



The project was supported by the Victorian Government – Sport and Recreation Victoria, Local Sports and Infrastructure Fund, the Calivil Bowling Club and Council.

Pyramid Hill barbecue shelter

Works on the Pyramid Hill Progress Park barbecue shelter are complete.

The project included the installation of the barbecue shelter, new electric barbecue, and table and bench seat set.

This project was identified through the Pyramid Hill Community Planning process and funded via the Loddon Shire Council Community Planning Funding Program.

Works update

Township street improvements

- Footpath construction and drainage works at Sloan Park are complete.
- Footpath works on McMillan Road and Armstrong Street in Boort have been completed.

Local bridge and culvert construction

- Upgraded floodways at Brennah Whela Road and Wedderburn Junction East are nearing completion.
- The culvert replacement on Appin South Road at Sheepwash Creek is complete.

Capital works completed

- From 1 July 2023 to 30 September 2023, four building projects were completed by Council's works department.
- Echuca Serpentine Road Construction works have commenced.

Maintenance inspection summary

From 1 July 2023 to 30 September 2023, 353 inspections were completed (1,410 defects raised), with 98.9% of all inspections completed before their due date.

Maintenance defect rectification

From 1 July 2023 to 30 September 2023, 1,646 defects were rectified, with 97.2% of all defects (1,611 in total) completed before their due date.

Maintenance grading program

From 1 July 2023 to 30 September 2023, 247 maintenance grading work actions were completed resulting in 574km of grading and 1,012km of inspections.

Parks and townships

From 1 July 2023 to 30 September 2023, 1,008 programmed maintenance and defects were rectified. These were maintenance actions on footpaths, street and park trees, garden beds, grass mowing and playgrounds, with 86.4% of all defects (871 in total) completed before their due date.

End of era for roads contract

After more than 20 years, Council will cease its maintenance contract with VicRoads (now Department of Transport and Planning) when the current contract expires on 31 December, returning responsibility for routine maintenance of the various arterial roads to the Department from that time.

Council's agreement provided for the routine maintenance of pavement, shoulders, roadside areas, drainage systems, road furniture and structure on various arterial roads within our Shire - 394km in total.

Requests or issues with Regional Roads Victoria roads can be reported by calling 133 778.

From 1 July 2023 to 30 September 2023, 589 defects were rectified under Council's contract, with 93.9% of all defects (588 in total) completed before their due date.

Glass recycling bins at landfill and transfer stations

Due to Victorian Government state-wide kerbside reforms, there are

major changes coming to the way we recycle glass.

Glass disposal points are now located at all Council waste facilities for residents to drop off used glass bottles and jars free of charge. This means glass manufacturers will be able to recycle twice as much glass.



Separating glass from other materials

When sorted into the correct bin, glass can be recycled again and again. Small fragments that can't be remade into bottles or jars, can be used in the construction sector in road base.

Glass that can be taken to drop off points

Sauce and condiment jars, wine bottles, beer bottles and glass soft drink bottles (rinsed and with corks and lids removed) can all be taken to a drop off point.

Glass that cannot be taken to drop off points

Drinking glasses, broken crockery, storage and baking ware, perfume bottles and window glass are not accepted at drop off points.

2024 kerbside waste collection, waste vouchers

The 2024 kerbside hard waste collection will commence on Monday 4 March, coinciding with Clean Up Australia Day on the first Sunday in March.

Items can be placed on the nature strip on Sunday 3 March (not before or after).

Properties eligible for the service are those with a mandatory kerbside waste bin and recycling bin collection service located in the Township Zone, Low Density Residential Zone and Rural Living Zones as defined within the Loddon Planning Scheme.

Outside of these zones, the kerbside bin collection service is optional and a kerbside hard waste collection is not provided.

Waste vouchers

Waste vouchers 1 and 2 are due to expire on 31 December. Each voucher can be used to dispose of up to four cubic metres of general domestic waste at Council's landfill and transfer stations free of charge.

This includes green waste, mixed recyclables, general household waste and e-waste (white goods, TVs, computers, electronic items, etc.).

Tyres, bricks and concrete, and mattresses are not included as these have additional third party costs associated with their disposal, and will be charged as per normal disposal charges.

Each voucher may only be used once, and only one voucher used per transaction.

Flood recovery works update

Council is continuing the mammoth task of restoring roads and infrastructure impacted by the October 2022 flood event.

Gravel resheets and culvert restorations have been completed at Bridgewater North, Wedderburn, Korong Vale and Serpentine.

Works have also been completed on gravel and sealed roads in Jarklin, Fernihurst, Boort and Dingee.

In June, a further \$1.25 million in restoration works was approved, these works were completed in November.

Restoration works have been made possible through the Federal and State Government-funded Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.

So far, Council has completed around \$4 million of restoration works.

In total, \$20 million of restoration works are planned for the 2023/24 Financial Year, followed by another possible \$15 million in 2024/25.

Council takes its responsibility to provide a safe road network seriously and appreciates the community's feedback.

We ask our community to please remember to drive with caution, follow any warning signs and drive to the conditions of our roads.

A head start with 1000 books before school

Children up to five years of age are invited to join the refreshed 1000 Books Before School program, which encourages parents and carers to read with their youngsters, helping to develop a love of reading, language and story before they start school.

Since its relaunch at the end of June, more than 900 children have signed up, with some already completing the challenge (and onto their second round) and many more making steady progress.

While reading 1000 books might seem like a lot, when built into a child's routine, it can become a fun and rewarding way to spend time together. The same story can be read multiple times, and books from storytime sessions count, as do eBooks audiobooks.
