The Spring Festival ends with the Inglewood Alive Festival on Sunday 4 November. The event brings together community groups from Inglewood and surrounding districts to promote the town to the wider region and beyond.

The street is transformed into a vibrant space filled with gourmet food vans, a food court, live entertainment, a custom car and motorcycle show and shine display, selected market stalls, exhibits from community groups, free children's activities and the Wimmera Axemen's Association Championship woodchop competition.



Tarnagulla Revisited 2018

The weather was a little unkind on the first morning of Tarnagulla Revisited 2018 and this meant a smaller visitor turnout than usual. The history display proved to be very successful with many visitors over the course of the day. The historic Pavilion was an excellent location, and many visitors appreciated



the opportunity to spend time looking over the lovely old building including the rustic upstairs ballroom. The history display was located in the equally rustic old waiters' room (as it was known in early years) and while space was restricted, people continued to crowd in.

Photographs posted on the <u>Tarnagulla.com</u> website show the old Tarnagulla Brass Band instruments that were kindly loaned for the day by descendants of Thomas Page, which were a real hit and performed by musical maestro Richard Shiell.

The Sunday belonged to the brilliant Nellie Melba concert in the Victoria Theatre, presented by the inimitable Rachel Buckley who has in recent years added so much to the musical scene in central Victoria. The Melba concert was extraordinarily good and a great success featuring Soprano Helen Koehne, Tenor James Macaulay, Baritone Jamie Moffat, piano accompanist Pam Christie and Narrator Rachel Buckley.

The Fire Danger Period for the Loddon Shire Council area began at 1am, Monday 22 October.


During the Fire Danger Period several fire restrictions and regulations apply, including around campfires and barbecues, burning off and other activities.
