

Loddon Shire Council 24th Statutory Meeting Minutes

(a Special Council Meeting)

7.00pm – 7 November 2019, Pyramid Hill Bowling Club

1. OPENING OF MEETING

The Chief Executive Officer opened the meeting and read the Council Prayer.

4. MAYORAL REPORT

The Chief Executive Officer invited the Mayor to report on her term of office in 2018/19.

I'd like to start by thanking my councillor colleagues for the support they have given me throughout the year – you have been an absolute pleasure to work with, and your enthusiasm and passion for you communities is evident.

I also acknowledge the great working relationship we as councillors have with the CEO and the executive team, who are a hard-working and dedicated group of people. Success is achieved only by building relationships that bring out the best in everyone. And much of my role as Mayor has been about building and nurturing relationships, from within Loddon Shire and all the way to Canberra and everywhere in between.

On average, each year Council collects just over \$10m in rates and charges, plus an annual allocation of around \$10m in recurrent grants – which, when combined, generally cover core business. We then have to go cap in hand to both governments for a further \$10m or so, to deliver any projects over and above the 'day to day' business. These projects are assessed on their merits, but also on councils' ability to deliver what it says it will deliver, and we continue to face challenges of timing and resourcing in delivering some long-awaited projects. We must do better - we will do better.

We continue to embrace the challenge, as we have in the past, and will into the foreseeable future, of operating in an environment of achieving more with less – while maintaining effectiveness and quality across all the activities we undertake.

Some significant projects we have been successful in gaining funding for this year include:

- A total of \$2.8m to undertake works on the Echuca Serpentine road, replacement of Murphy's Creek Bridge, rehabilitation of Newbridge Road, and the Bridgewater Raywood road.
- The Federal Government's Regional Growth Fund, along with Council's contribution, that will deliver \$1.7m towards our Caravan Park upgrades, and Stage 2 of the Bridgewater foreshore project.
- \$14.5m from the Federal government will go with the \$11m previously committed by the State Government, for the Mitiamo Pipeline Project, following a strong advocacy campaign led by the dedicated Mitiamo Pipeline committee and actively supported by Council.
- The Donaldson Park upgrade received a funding commitment of \$2.5m, as well as some smaller grants to install flood-lights at a number of our Rec reserves.
- Loddon has a strong record of placing the recreational facilities at all our major sporting grounds very high up on our list of funding priorities. We strive for top class, high standard facilities that you can be proud of, and that will attract players, supporters and their families to your clubs, and encourage our youth to actively participate in sporting activities.
- We run a number of programs to support our youth, such as the Kool Skools and Kool Arts programs, which produce some amazing results, as well as Freeza events at our pools, art competitions and Australia Day award competitions.

Events celebrated over the past year include the official opening of the Wedderburn Streetscape Project, numerous Australia Day events, a number of Citizenship ceremonies, the Loddon Food & Wine Expo at Newbridge, and the launch of the new Loddon Visitor Guide, Tourism website and facebook page, which is now linked to Bendigo Regional Tourism's new website, and should increase Loddon's exposure to a whole new market.

But it hasn't all been cause for celebration - The news of the Pyramid Hill hostel closure has been devastating. Since the announcement, Wendy and her Community Wellbeing Department, have been working with the Hostel Working Group, exploring alternative models of aged care delivery and funding. Council currently delivers services to older members of our community through the Commonwealth Home Support Program, and provide on the ground services on behalf of agencies who deliver Home-Care package services, enabling people to remain in their homes longer – called Ageing in Place - but there often comes a time when a higher level of care is necessary, and 'Ageing in Place' shouldn't stop at your front gate – your 'Place' is in your community. We will continue to pursue opportunities, and hope for a better outcome.

It is important that we continue to invest in the things that are valued most by our communities, things that make a positive difference in people's lives, such as our swimming pools, library services, playgrounds, halls, parks and open spaces.

Council would not be able to deliver all its services or manage all its facilities without community volunteers – so, to you and your various committees, I thank you on behalf of council for all the volunteer hours you put in.

And speaking of volunteers, a big thankyou to the Bowling Club members for their excellent hospitality here tonight.
