#### Eddington Community History:

Eddington developed at the natural crossing point on the Loddon River on the road between Dunolly and Maldon. Originally a punt operated the crossing but when a bridge was built c1861 and the township was subdivided in 1863, commercial buildings sprung up along McCoy Street, the road to the original bridge site. Pubs opened on both sides of the river, stores, saleyards, saddlery, bank, stock and station agent, chemist and blacksmith. Business developed along the river to supply the expanding population with the necessities of life – flour, butter, cheese, beer and the bottles to put it in. When gold mining in the vicinity dwindled and the new river crossing at its current location went ahead in 1926, the township was bypassed and the population decline accelerated.


#### **Businesses:**

## Eddington community planning background review from 2006

Eddington produced its Community Plan in 2003 as a result of community workshops and consultation. A draft was circulated, amendments made and the final version approved and submitted to Council. The Eddington Community Centre Committee has reported to the community regularly on progress with planned works and has followed up with the Shire where necessary. A community meeting was held on Wednesday 22 February 2006 to review the Plan.

#### This plan allowed our community to achieve the following:

- Fencing of the area from the Loddon Miniature Railway gate to the Hall along McCoy Street, from the rear of the toilets to the gate of the Golf Club along Playfair Street and from the tennis courts to the commencement of the Golf Course, as well as chaining off the BBQ area parkland, was commissioned and completed by the Eddington community by using DSE grant moneys to pay for the work. This has allowed the transformation of the BBQ area into parkland, rather than parking space.
- Completion of landscaping of triangle in centre of the crossroads area and corners of Playfair/McCoy Streets.
- Completion of Town Information Board and erection outside Hall.
- Completion of new signage on Bendigo/Maryborough Road.
- Relocation of the historic backdrop curtain at the Eddington Community Centre from the front to the back of the stage to preserve it and provide a backdrop (it was being damaged by being used as a front of stage curtain)
- Installation of a lighting and sound system at the Eddington Community Centre we stage community shows which attract large audiences from far and wide.

Solar panels 2020 Shire Community grant and community funds. Dishwasher funding Maldon Community Bendigo Bank, New fridge and freezer grant Maldon Community Bendigo Bank, DEFIB grant Maldon Community Bank. Minor maintenance jobs are carried out by the committee when needed.



The following objectives were not completed or our community decided that it was no longer necessary.

- To create access to the stage at the Eddington Community Centre from the supper room this will require creating a door and providing a few steps. We use the supper room as a dressing room and this would allow direct access to the stage without having to go through the audience area in the Hall or round the outside in all weathers to the far side of the stage provide wardrobe facilities in the supper room.
- Restoration of the Avenue of Honour identification of planting and names of Returned Servicemen and new plaques to be put in position.

Every effort has been made to find the plaques etc. with no luck. So, the community have established an area in the community BBQ area that Honours our servicemen, servicewoman and the light horse (Beersheba) Funding from our community.

#### Developing our community plan.

In January 2021 the draft of the current plan was presented to the Eddington Community Centre committee and emailed to the wider community requesting feedback.

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2021 a meeting with Loddon Shire Council representatives Kirsten McKay, Sarah Perry and Cr Linda Jungwirth was conducted including an informal walk and talk regarding the community planning.

As a result of Covid-19 restrictions in 2021 the progression of the community plan was limited however with the relaxation of restrictions on 2022 planning recommenced.

The draft template of the plan was emailed and printed for community feedback on the National Tree Day 31<sup>st</sup> July 2022 in Eddington.

Following feedback received this has been added into the draft and re-circulated to the community via email.

Ongoing communication with Loddon Shire Martin Mark Community Development Officer has been valuable.

Community member and resident Joanne Lazzaro proof read the draft in January 2023 and supplied feedback which has been added and emailed to the wider community for open communication.

We are now looking forward to presenting our community plan to the Loddon Shire Council.

#### OUR COMMUNITY PLAN 2023-2033

Current and long-term objectives

- Town Sewerage System still a high priority, caring for our environment and the health of our river system and those that live on LODDON RIVER.
- Watering system in the BBQ area as this space is our Dedicated Emergency Site for both flood and fire, we identify this as a high priority.
- Playground equipment and sunshade has been added to this space to attract locals and day-trippers ongoing maintenance needed by council and community, soft fall when needed.
- Native garden between the Playground and Loddon Miniature Steam Locomotive Society.
- Sunshade in the BBQ area.
- Rotunda needs painting, this has been relocated from the Eddington Primary School and has heritage significance to our community.
- Fresh water access for local bike riders, campers, day trippers, community. Maybe a small tank at the BBQ shelter.
- Wicking veggie beds on the third tennis court, fruit trees, sunshade, snakes and ladders game or large chess games.
- Loddon river walking tracks in the township "TISSOT WALK" named after the secretary of the Cheese Factory which closed in 1900.
- Move the Community Sign so we can access the back for WHAT'S ON section.
- Eddington Landcare Red gum forest walking track for day trippers. Access via Hogan's Track, bird watching, nature walks, fungi notification, bird boxes.
- Tennis and Golf social club repainting the surface on the two tennis courts.
- ARTWORK on the shipping container
- Update the chairs inside the hall, veranda over the kitchen area, this would make dropping off food in the wet weather less stressful for our volunteers and shade the kitchen in the summer time.

This log was moved from the Eddington Bridge and located to the Primary School for many years before locals moved it to the golf course.
