Community Plans are developed by the community for the community.

Community planning is a forum that enables community members to identify what is important in their community.

Community planning encourages people in the community to have their say, encouraging them to be actively and genuinely involved in providing their thoughts and visions for the future of their community. Community planning assists in identifying the direction the community wants to take to move forward, as well as documenting some of the ideas and suggestions to make it happen.

Community planning encourages local people to get involved. It is designed to have a strong 'grass-roots' approach to shaping the future of communities, where needs are determined by the community, with local residents taking charge of their community's destinies. This "bottom-up" community engagement mechanism is centered on community-driven action and change, and has delivered positive outcomes to the municipality's communities over a number of years.

Community planning has a strong and proud history in the Loddon Shire Council, having delivered many important and significant projects which communities use and enjoy. Once developed, Community Plans serve as frameworks for community members, Council and other organisations to identify and prioritise projects that are important to our communities.

The benefits of community planning can be seen across three inter-related areas:

1. Connecting with communities

- community members meet each other and/or develop their connections
- similar concerns / projects of interest are identified
- common values are identified and documented

2. Developing resilience

- generosity and helpfulness is developed amongst community members
- community successes are recognised together and shared together
- community members coordinate to help each other

3. Connecting with Council and other organisations

- communities work to achieve community outcomes with assistance from Council and other organisations
- council is informed and attuned to community needs and wants

The Community Vision is a voice to ensure our partnerships with organisations and sectors in the community, such as not-for-profits, service organisations and local businesses are working towards the same community plan.



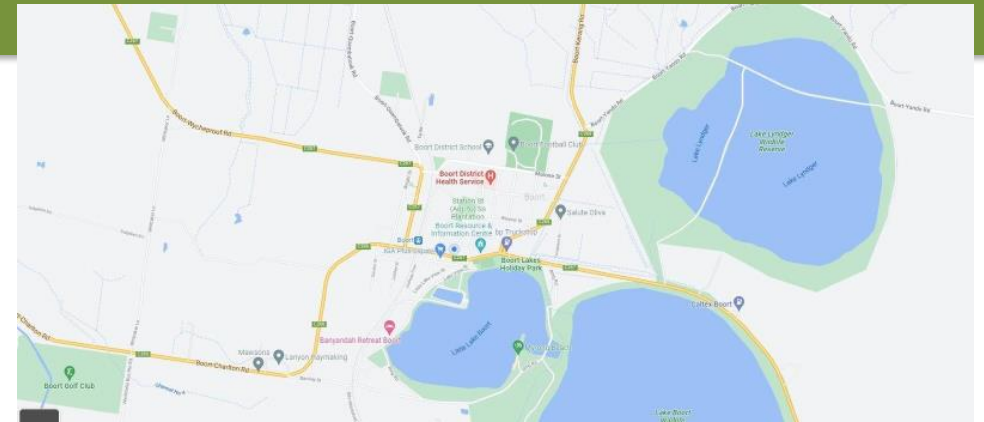
MISSION

Moulded by its past, Boort is an energetic community driven by its desire to improve and grow into the future. The skills and strengths of each member of the community binds it together so that the community may prosper. Although there are many exciting possibilities for future development this can only occur if there is a sustainable infrastructure within the town to support these activities.

BOORT

Boort, and its surrounding district, forms part of the Loddon Shire Council, located in North Central Victoria, 255 kilometers north west of Melbourne.

The Boort district forms part of the northern region of the shire. Boort, the aboriginal word for smoke, and Bald Hill where the town now stands, was a major signaling ground for the aborigines who lived in the area. Major Thomas Mitchell, on his 1836 expedition, passed through the Fernihurst area and, later, Burke & Wills led their expedition through the district passing near Durham Ox at a time when white settlement had begun. "Boort" Station was first owned by Mr. Thomas Bear who sold it to the Godfrey family in 1842.



From then on Boort's future as an Agricultural Centre was established. Despite diversification from traditional grain and sheep farming into more intensive forms such as dairying, viticulture, tomatoes, oil seed, pulses, olive and fodder crops, the rural character of the district has been maintained, "The prosperity of any country town depends almost entirely upon the prosperity of the surrounding district" [Smoke From the Hill - Page 10 - Author, Fae Stevens] and Boort is no exception. Within the scope of this plan there are thirteen of these small communities, and each has a proud record of achievement – Barraport, Canary Island, Catumnal, Durham Ox, Fernihurst, Gredgwin, Leighur, Lake Marmal. Minmindie, Mysia, Terrapee, Wychitella and Yando – but Boort has remained the heart of the locality.



Built on the banks of the lake, Boort grew and developed, being incorporated into the Gordon Shire in 1885. During the shire amalgamations and redistributions of boundaries in 1995 the Shire of Gordon ceased to exist and became part of the present-day Shire of Loddon. Today Boort is a thriving rural community but it must plan for the future. Following a public meeting on 6th February 2003, facilitated by the Shire of Loddon, the Boort Community Planning Team was formed for the purpose of developing a community plan with a vision for the future development of Boort and district. A bus trip to closely study the local area together with public consultation and “brainstorming” ideas from a public meeting have been considered and collated. The map based on one from the book ‘Smoke From the Hill’, gives a schematic diagram of the district

Boort is a tourist destination all year round, particularly during the warmer months from September to the end of April. Tourists come to explore and seek adventure, relax and take in nature or enjoy the Little Lake Boort for boating, water skiing, canoeing, sailing, fishing, swimming and bird watching.

Boort has a unique setting with a caravan park situated directly on the foreshore of ten grassy acres on the edge of the pristine Little Lake Boort. Tourist also have access to local produce including award winning gourmet green tomatoes and olive products. The Arts are strongly represented with access to the evolving Metal Sculpture trail. Boort is also home to the “Spanner Man”, world class metal sculptures.

Working in partnership with the Loddon Shire Council, Boort will strive to encourage the development of projects and events leading to a strong and economically viable local community.



BOORT AGRICULTURAL ACTIVITIES

The township of Boort is located within a unique agricultural district. We are very fortunate to have a multitude of varying agricultural commodities and production methods. From the rich heavy soils that follow the flood plain of the Loddon River, to the fertile sandy loam soils that border the Wimmera and Mallee cropping districts, we are fortunate to have such versatile soil types. Only to be strengthened by a reliable irrigation system, within the Goulburn Murray Irrigation District.

The irrigation within our district, along with our soil types have allowed for great investment in our district. This includes the production of olives, grapes, tomatoes, corn and other intensive irrigated crops. This has therefore attracted large corporate companies to our region who see great value in our lands, and in turn have created many employment opportunities in our town.

Boort is a powerhouse in the production of the main stays of broad acre agriculture, from wheat, barley and canola to legumes like lentils and faba beans. Hay is a large proportion of our agricultural program, with vetch hay being a staple of most cropping rotations and some oaten hay throughout the district. Lucerne has traditionally been a very popular hay crop in the district as it is a very high quality, high yielding crop when irrigated. Our district is also a prominent livestock producing region, with prime lamb production as well as merino wool production being abundant. There are also Angora Goats, producing Mohair largely for export.

The greater Boort district is also home to many more artisan agricultural and horticultural businesses. From the creation of locally made olive oils and marinated olives, as well as Chilli preserves and sauces, to locally made Woollen Bedding and Quilts. There is great value in these unique agricultural businesses not only regarding their produce but also the value they bring to tourism in the area. With Bendigo right on our doorstep as 'Australia's City of Gastronomy', we should take great pride in the agricultural produce that originates in Boort.

Year-round activities

- Freight of grain and hay from district to port/dairies/feed mills
- Sale of livestock
- Shearing/crutching/livestock contractors
- Freight of fertilizer/chemicals into the district

From **Table 1** on page 8, we can extrapolate that there is always a large agricultural harvest taking place, no matter the season. This results in large labor requirements and shortages in these times. Especially in olive harvest, tomato weeding and harvest periods, and grain harvest. This also results in great demand on our road network throughout the year, not only at grain harvest. Therefore we need to ensure that we allocate greater resources in the maintenance of the roads greatest affected by traffic from multiple industries.

THE COMMUNITY PLAN STRUCTURE

Boort Tourism and Development (BTD) Committee consult with the Loddon Shire Council to advocate for the direction of the development of the Boort Township and Community.

Funding is provided to the community through the Loddon Shire Council Smarty Grants. There are Community and Event Smarty Grants available through the Loddon Shire Council throughout the year, as needs arise. There is also funding provided to each Shire Ward every 5 Years, and these funds are helpful and often necessary to gain further funding from other grants, to instigate large projects for the town.

Each heading lists the areas where the community sees a need for improvement or change. The document provides a summary of the need and where it has been identified as priorities between HIGH, MEDIUM and LOW.

If an item is listed as a HIGH priority, this means the community believe that action should be taken to improve or make a change for the future of the town immediately or start to engage the Loddon Shire Council in preparation for the change to occur. It may also mean that funding through the Smarty Grants will be required.

Some items listed do not seek any funding through the Loddon Shire Council, however, they may require approval through the Council. These projects may or may not be listed as a priority, as they are they do not rely on funds from the Community Smarty Grant funds. This does not mean that the projects are less important, or do not seek community attention, they are still key items to further develop the region.

A MEDIUM OR LOW priority item does not also mean that it isn't currently being addressed or working towards a resolution.

It simply means that the community will not greatly suffer if the timeframe is extended beyond a year, or it may take at least a year to bring the project to fruition.

Many projects may take years to complete from the initial planning stages, seeking approvals and breaking ground. Other projects may run in conjunction with larger projects and be completed quickly, depending on the services required.

In line with the guidelines from the Loddon Shire Council, the Boort Community Plan is organised under the following eleven headings listed below:

PROJECTS TO BE PRIORITISED

PRIORITY 1.

Little Lake Boort Foreshore Recreational Precinct (delivered by Loddon Shire Council).

In 2019 the Boort Tourism and Development Committee began to develop a Master Plan for the Boort Recreation Precinct (Nolen's Park). A core component of the project included a review of the area and the need to develop the park to include a wider variety of accessible activities. Nolen's Park is located on Godfrey Street and rests on the Little Lake in Boort and adjacent to the Boort Lakes Holiday Park. The facility is currently home to a range of user groups including tennis, scouts, family history research, indoor sports (boxing, martial arts) at the James Boyle Hall, water sports, playground, Merry Go Round, large community events, Ski Club, Lawn Bowls, Croquet, Walking Track and Park Run. The overall vision for Recreational Precinct, is to meet the needs and requirements of the user groups, community and council. Ultimately, the Master Plan will guide council and user group decision-making and resource allocation. The Precinct has undergone changes in recent years to meet the sporting needs of the community and visitors. A number of these upgrades, additions and changes have resulted in ad hoc development around the site without following a strategic, united plan and vision to meet anticipated future needs. Refurbishment of the Tennis Club fencing and lighting has been an additional driver for this project. Through analytical site analysis, background research and community consultation, the Master Plan aims to provide optimal and innovative use of the Precinct for sport and recreation groups including providing a range of opportunities for all ages and abilities.

GOAL

To increase options in the town for Sport and Recreation facilities and make them accessible for all ages and all year-round activities.

The staging of the Little Lake Boort Foreshore Recreation Precinct Project as follows:

Stage 1 Boort Bowls Club Inc Synthetic Turf Project

Stage 2 Master Plan of Little Lake Boort Foreshore Recreation Precinct Project which will include costing estimates and identification of potential external funding opportunities.

This includes the skate park, tennis court fencing and lighting, half basketball court and croquet facilities.

Stage 3 Construction of Little Lake Boort Foreshore Recreation Precinct Project as identified in the stage 2 design

ACTION

The Project budget currently has \$500,000 available. Following the allocation of funding for Stage 1 of the project, the remaining funds will support the planning component of Stage 2 and any unspent funds held to attract identified external funding opportunities to deliver the remaining components of the project (Stage 3). Stage 1 will require some administration and supervision by Council officers. Council will be providing resources to deliver the project.

TASK

Sport and Recreation

- It is important and exciting to note that the Boort community have prioritised the need to provide facilities for sporting, recreation and community activities:
- Ensuring public areas are accessible for older people and those with a disability. Clearly, these two issues have direct links with the development of the facilities within Park.

Health and Wellbeing

- This theme includes the following strategies: Promote physical activity and recreation

Support community-based sport and recreation organisations and programs.

The project scope includes:

- bowls club synthetic green
- tennis courts fencing
- tennis courts lighting and other possible upgrades, to service and attract people to play tennis
- installation of a skate park/recreational facilities
- installation of a basketball half court
- Croquet equipment shed replacement, toilets upgraded, pavers replaced with concrete and 3 shelter sheds constructed.

Stage 1 - replacement of the Boort Bowls Club irrigated turf with a suitable synthetic alternative. (Complete in Sept 2022)

Stages 2 and 3 are to be completed as a single project, planned and delivered in line with Council's Annual Plan timeline.

Master Plan: being the planning, design and costing of the skate park and basketball half-court, tennis fencing and lighting and works at the croquet club. There may be additional works to support these identified elements such as footpaths and drainage.

Stage 3 being the funding and construction of the works as identified in **Stage 2**.

This project will be funded from the Lake Boort Foreshore Recreation Precinct Project (the Project) budget and the Loddon Shire Council

Approval the funding application from Boort Bowls Club for the amount of \$301,970 to deliver **Stage 1**.

To separate the project into three stages and commit funds from the Project budget to complete **Stage 1**, being the Boort Bowls Club (the Club) synthetic turf installation. The Club will install a World Bowls approved synthetic surface at the Bowls Club, with the project costing \$301,970 exGST. The Club have registered for GST and have committed to covering the GST component of the project. The Club have also committed to taking responsibility for any cost overruns. If the proposed staging arrangement were approved by Council including Stage 1 being funded prior to the design stage, the Club will be required to enter into a formal funding agreement, with specific milestones and acquittal requirements. The project and payment milestones have been provided by the Club as per their application for funding. The application has been assessed by a panel of Council

officers and has been deemed to be satisfactory. There are no funding guidelines available to direct the assessment panel, rather the application is deemed compliant, as sufficient information has been provided to enable an understanding of the project particulars, to develop a funding agreement and to assess the planned delivery of the project. This model of funding the project delivery has been considered as the project is being delivered on an existing like for like footprint with a low risk of unidentified issues.

PRIORITY 2.

Godfrey Street, Boort Street Scope: The aim of the Street Scope is to revitalise the Boort main street (Godfrey Street) to attract new business activity and people to the Town Centre. It is envisioned that this will be realised through a series of public realm, built form and streetscape interventions that will improve the visual amenity, design quality, vitality and function of the urban environment within Godfrey Street. The Plan will assist Council to prioritise public domain improvement works, anticipate future renewal works and improve the overall function of the local street. It will also inform preferred future-built form outcomes. The Plan could include several areas of focus such as public realm and streetscape, key development opportunities, infrastructure and services, heritage, built form control, retail strategy and housing strategy. The focus for now is public realm and streetscape, although the plan will also touch on built form, heritage and retail where it interfaces with public realm. The Plan will seek to outline improvements in the public realm that can also act as catalyst by triggering private investment. The public realm refers to any publicly owned land. This includes streets, footpaths, parks, and government-owned land.

The Plan may seek to influence the design of:

- Footpaths, laneways and street scape
- Parking
- Places for sitting, gathering, socialising, outdoor dining
- Bicycle infrastructure
- Street trees and canopy
- Wayfinding and signage
- Façades

GOAL

To improve the Street Scope in Godfrey Street, Boort

ACTION

The Loddon Shire Council will: complete a plan, seek funding , consult with the community, action the stages of the plan

TASK

Place power underground

Fix Godfrey Street parking bays. It is currently difficult and dangerous to exit your car from parallel parking and dangerous to back out of the angle parking. Parking needs to be addressed – dangerous backing out with trucks increasing in the main street.

Fix paving outside the IGA store and other areas on Godfrey Street

Provide hand rails on shopping strip side (as per the current rail near the Opportunity Shop)

Approach the IGA Store to utilise the vacant land between the supermarket and Railway Hotel for seating

Revegetation of plants and trees

Suggestion to have fairy lights installed permanently in the main street (Godfrey Street)

Provision of off-street parking

Improved street lighting Improved access to public buildings and shops for the disabled

PRIORITY 3.

Boort Park: Upgrade Facilities

Netball Courts are not meeting Netball Victoria Standards for safe playing, due to the cracked surface. Community sports and recreation facilities are quickly becoming outdated. Boort Park facilities do not provide the range of amenities to attract and sustain women and girls to sport. The facilities do not have adequate disability access and also do not provide the required facilities for umpires of football. Throughout Victoria and in particular small communities, there is a lower participation rate in sport and active recreation of women to men, mainly due to inadequate facilities. The facilities at Boort Park play a key factor in encouraging female participation. This includes players and umpires. It is vital for female friendly change rooms at Boort Park for female participation to increase. Facilities at Boort Park should appropriately and equitably meet the particular needs of females in the community. Facility access demand is increasing through the growth in junior and female participation. Most of the facilities that are used for football have historically been built to cater for male usage only. If we are to continue to attract more girls and women, there is a need to provide welcoming physical environments. This includes ensuring that all players and umpires have access to appropriate change, shower and toilet facilities. People often think of female change rooms as separate dedicated change facilities. This is not the case. Rather it is about transforming the existing amenities to cater for greater flexibility in use, removing urinals and open showers and replacing with toilet cubicles and shower cubicles that allow showering and changing in privacy. In other words, great change facilities cater equally well for all users. There are also other facility elements that help make a welcoming facility and club environment. These include cleanliness of the change, shower and toilet areas, provision of sanitary bins and external pavilion and car park lighting to provide additional safety and security during and after training and night matches. These elements should also be front of mind when considering new and upgraded facilities.

GOAL To fix/resurface the netball court surface. To upgrade change rooms facilities. To move the Time keepers Box.

ACTION

To complete a scope/design, apply for funding, apply for permit, have plans drawn up. Begin construction out of key usage times.
To complete the tasks in two stages: Netball courts are a priority to meet standards for the next season.

TASK(S) – Two stages

STAGE 1: To resurface the netball courts x 2

Usage - The Netball Courts usage season and training begins in February through to the end of September. In October the A&P Society utilise the area for Boort Show events and the Harness Racing utilise the surface for seating to be near TAB area in January and March.

Netball Courts – engineer to come and assess damage/conditions and decide what needs doing to fix.

Surface to be discussed. There are no regulations with Netball Vic, so the type of surface is up to the Boort Committee. The Size must adhere to standards.

Quote already received - \$32,000 was a quote in 2023 to resurface on top of the existing courts with a rebound surface. The Boort Netball club have already fundraised to assist with the payment and are also looking at grants to assist fund the project.

STAGE 2: To upgrade change rooms facilities and move the timekeepers box

Avoid trough and individual wall hung urinals. Convert all urinals into individual partitioned toilet pans. Provide as a minimum one ambulant accessible toilet cubicle in each amenity and umpires rooms as required by current codes and standards. Avoid wall-hung basins with no shelf space. Provide vanity / shelving / ledge and mirror behind. Provide electrical outlets in close proximity to vanities.

Player amenities (toilet / showers) As a minimum, provision for two change rooms to cater for home and away teams per oval on site is required. Showers: lockable cubicle showers are preferred.

Toilets: there is no expectation to install urinals in player amenity areas. Replacement of urinals with an additional toilet pan or appropriate screening should be considered to provide more flexible usage options. Three showers with three pan toilets.

Changes rooms Two separate change rooms (one home and one away team) with bench seating provided around the room perimeter. If lockers are included then the size of the room may need to increase to compensate. Clothing bags / hooks above bench seating.

Massage / strapping room / separate room immediately adjacent to each change room is to be provided with massage / strapping tables for use by home and away teams. Can be performed within a change room with appropriate screening to cater for more flexible usage options.

Umpires rooms: Umpires rooms need to be gender neutral and cater for diversity, particularly female umpires. The provision of areas where changing can occur in private is critical to the retention of umpires. Options also should be considered for a 'common area' with benches for use during breaks where umpires are able to congregate.

All facility:

Showers: two (minimum) within a lockable cubicle toilet

Hand basin: one

Seating: bench seating and clothes / bag hooks

PRIORITY 4.**Cricket Club Shed and Shade facilities**

The Boort - Yando Cricket Club is seeking funding to build a shed/clubhouse and shade structure to create a home for the members of the club. The Cricket Club currently has no facilities, and would like to build a shed/clubhouse on the Boort District School oval. This shed/clubhouse would be able to house the clubs equipment, provide shade for the players, children and spectators and to have a kitchenette where food and drinks could be prepared and served.

GOAL

To build a shed/clubhouse that would become the home base for the Boort-Yando Cricket Club. Shed would consist of lockable storage area for equipment, kitchenette, with canteen style roller doors and bench tops for food service. Open shed with veranda to give shade for spectators.

ACTION

Stage 1: Fundraising to get \$65,000 for stage 1: build shed/clubhouse and concreting of site. Long term agreement for use of facilities with Boort District School. Permits with council for project. Preparation of site for build. Shed/clubhouse construction and concreting of site.
Stage 2: Further fundraising for stage 2.

TASK

Stage 1: Fundraising is well underway. There is a current agreement with the BDS for use of grounds. BYCC would like to see an extension to this agreement prior to any works being completed. Shed/clubhouse to be constructed once agreement and final fundraising complete
Stage 2: Internal fit out.

TIMEFRAME

Short: 1-2 years Medium: 1-5 years

PRIORITY

STATUS

Have \$10,000 council grant. Looking for more to reach fundraising goal sooner. More funding would go towards completing Stage 2 of the shed project.

PRIORITY 5.

GMW Channel: Improvement of drainage, maintain current flow rate and extend the Boort Lakes Holiday Park on top of the channel. (Channel to be piped)

GOAL

To pipe the no. 3 channel from Yot's bridge on the Ring Road to the bridge on the Boort-Pyramid Road (approx 400m). To maintain the same flow rate required to supply farms. To fix Yot's Bridge for easier access for long vehicles around the Ring Road.

ACTION

To carry out design, costing and construction of this project. To carry out feasibility study to ensure flow rate remains the same.

TASK

To continue to supply water to irrigation farms at the current or better flow capacity.
To have the irrigation water piped to provide safety and extension of caravan park to the east of the channel.

PARTNERS

Goulburn-Murray Water and Loddon Shire Council, Farmers that rely on irrigation supply from this channel.

TIMEFRAME

Short: 1-2 years Medium: 1-5 years

PRIORITY

High Medium Low

• STATUS

GMW have inspected the site and are aware these works are required, mainly for safety reasons as the channels is adjacent to the Boort Lakes Holiday Park. A detailed design and costing is to be carried out by GMW.
Consultation with irrigation farmers that rely on the water supply/demand must still be met.
Lease holders of the caravan park are in consultation with the Loddon Sire Council and GMW.
The channel behind the caravan park up to Yots Bridge – feasibility to pipe the channel and give the Caravan Park access to the channel site and up to the Ring Road.

PRIORITY 6.

Amity shed: To concrete floor

GOAL To concrete to reduce dust, rodents and make the volunteer load less to maintain the shed and the equipment stored in it. To be environmentally sustainable, economically sustainable and safer for all users (volenteers).
ACTION To receive a Smarty Grant and organise works to be completed. To ensure environmentally sustainable measures are in place. To ensure incorporate economically sustainable measures. To action the set up for concrete to be poured: Streader Constructions to complete the works.
TASK Seek funding from the Loddon Shire Council Smarty Grant Remove items currently in the shed Concrete floor of the shed
