

Boort: Lakeside charm and cultural richness

The area's natural charm is enhanced by abundant birdlife thriving around Little Lake Boort, the culturally significant seasonal Lake Boort, and the nearby swamps rich in flora and fauna. After a day on the water, visitors can unwind with fresh coffee and regional cuisine at the town's welcoming cafés.

Steeped in First Nations heritage, Boort invites visitors to marvel at ancient scar trees and connect with culture at the Yung Balug Aboriginal Museum near Lake Boort.

In spring, Boort comes alive with the Boort Agricultural & Pastoral Society Show and Truck Show, celebrating local traditions with attractions like sheep dog trials, truck displays, fireworks, and so much more.

Art lovers are drawn to the Spanner Sculpture Gardens which feature the late John Piccoli's remarkable metal

work of more than 50 largerthan-life sculptures of horses, bulls, mermaids, and more. all crafted from thousands of farm spanners collected across Victoria and beyond.

For those seeking adventure, the Serpentine Creek canoe trail in Durham Ox, just a short drive from Boort, offers a peaceful escape for paddlers amidst serene natural surroundings. Meanwhile, nature enthusiasts can explore The Granites Scenic Reserve at Mount Egbert and Leaghur State Park, perfect for hiking and wildlife spotting.

Favourite destination or village?



Pyramid Hill: History meets nature under starlit skies

Pyramid Hill and its neighbouring towns offer an enchanting mix of history, culture, and natural beauty, crowned by the region's spectacular clear night skies. The town of Pyramid Hill is named after its striking granite landmark, first sighted by Major Thomas Mitchell in 1836.

Visitors can enjoy sweeping countryside views from the hill's summit, while the Pyramid Hill and District Historical Museum and the town's art deco architecture offer a glimpse into the past. Nearby Kow Swamp is a place of immense cultural importance to the First Nations people. The area is also a haven for birdwatchers and anglers, with abundant birdlife and opportunities to fish for Murray Cod and Golden Perch.

Nearby Mitiamo is the gateway to Terrick Terrick National Park, inviting nature lovers to explore its scenic trails, the Davies House Ruins, and the habitat of the endangered Plains-wanderer bird. The town's landmarks, including the War Memorial and R.J. Phelan Reserve, reflect its strong community ties and history.

Mount Hope, an iconic landmark once climbed by Major Mitchell, offers sweeping views of farmland and surrounding landscape. Its picnic facilities and tranquil setting make it an ideal spot for relaxation and reflection amidst breathtaking scenery.

By night, the region transforms into a stargazer's dream, with its crystal-clear skies drawing astronomy enthusiasts from near and far.



Immerse yourself in the Loddon Valley's central region, where history, culture, and natural beauty converge to create a captivating escape. Once the world's richest area during the gold rush, this landscape continues to enchant visitors with its enduring connection to the past.

At the heart of this golden region are the townships of Wedderburn, Inglewood, and Tarnagulla, each offering unique opportunities to explore and relax.

Wedderburn, a cultural hub, invites you to delve into its golden history at the Coach House Gallery Museum and Hard Hill Tourist Reserve, where stories of the past come alive. For those seeking tranquillity, the Birds Eye View Murals and Wychitella Bush Reserve offer peaceful spots for birdwatching and quiet reflection.







Old Kingower Vineyard, formally known as Blanche Barkly Wines, is situated in the beautiful hamlet of Kingower, Victoria. Alvin and David Reimers planted the vines in 1972. In 1975, Arleen, David's future wife, joined the venture and thus began the first of 50 vintages... still going with David and Arleen.

Then they built the unique and timeless stone cellar, which was completed in 1978... over 200 tons of local stone! A visit to the cellar door is certain to kindle an appetite for old world style vintage red table wine, all estate grown, vintaged and bottled. The vine whisperer, Arleen, manicures her vines, the roots of which sink down through the ancient Cambrian clay and gravel beds to produce low yields (kgs per acre, not tons). The vines are all organically grown, without irrigation.
